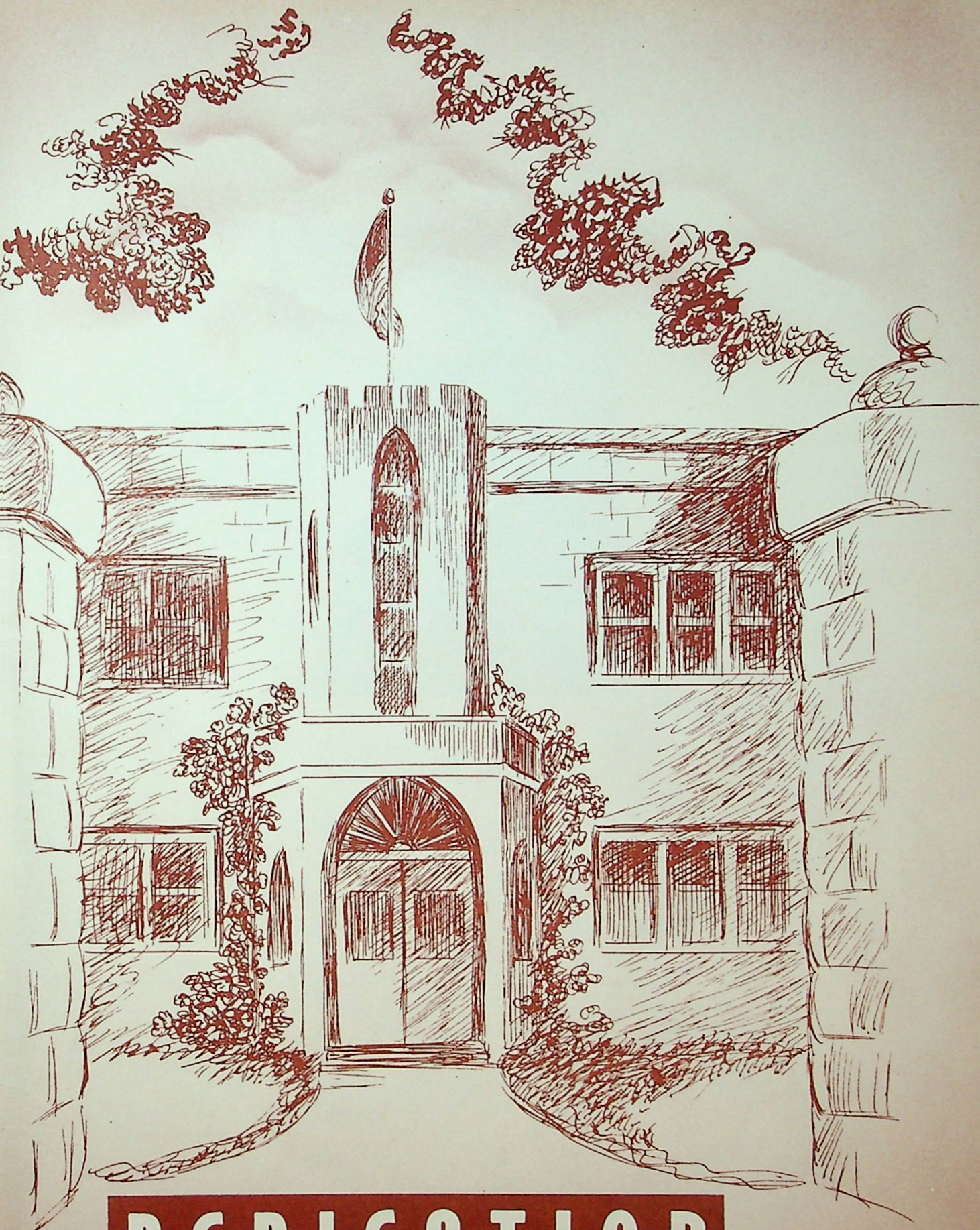


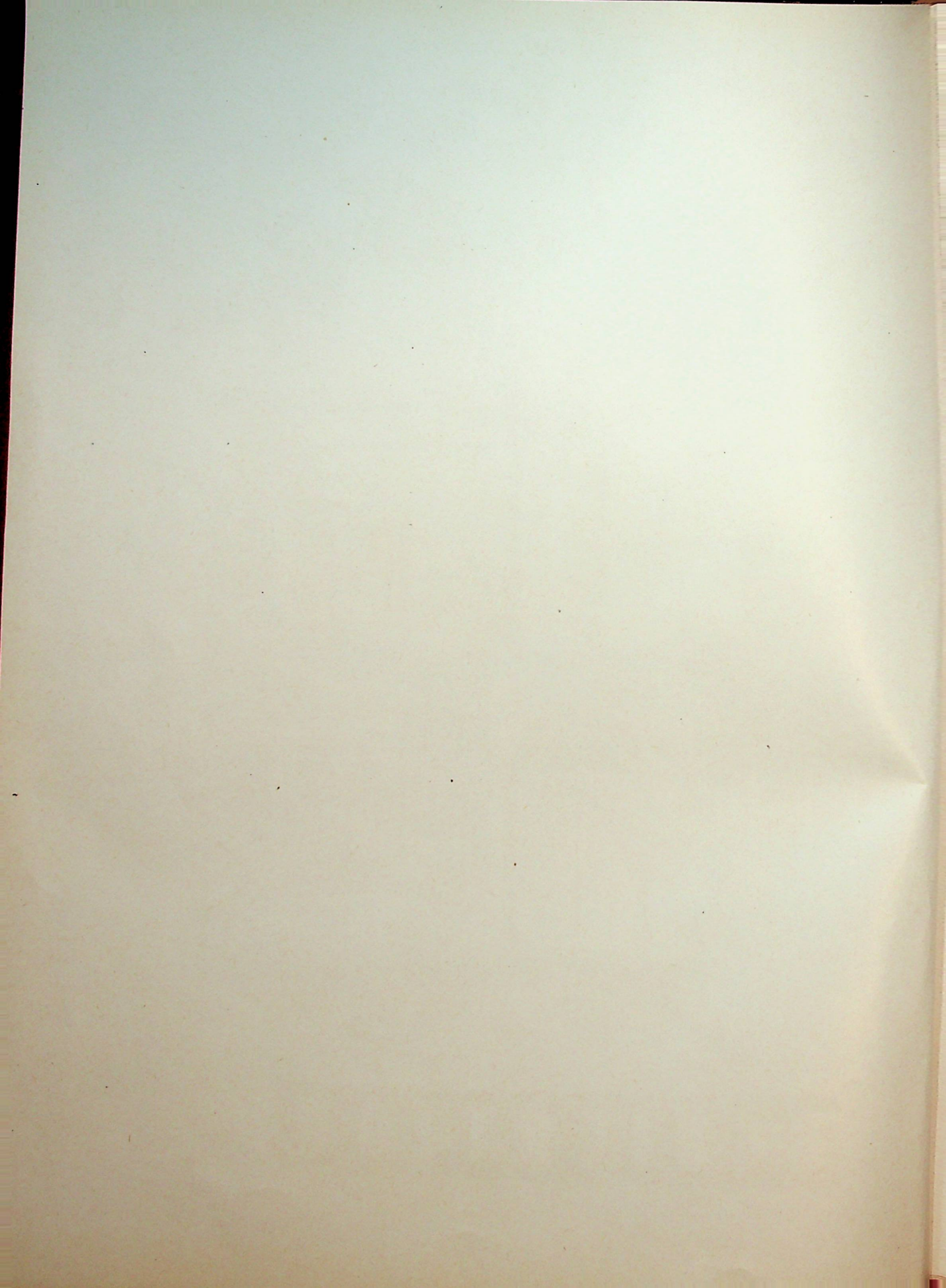

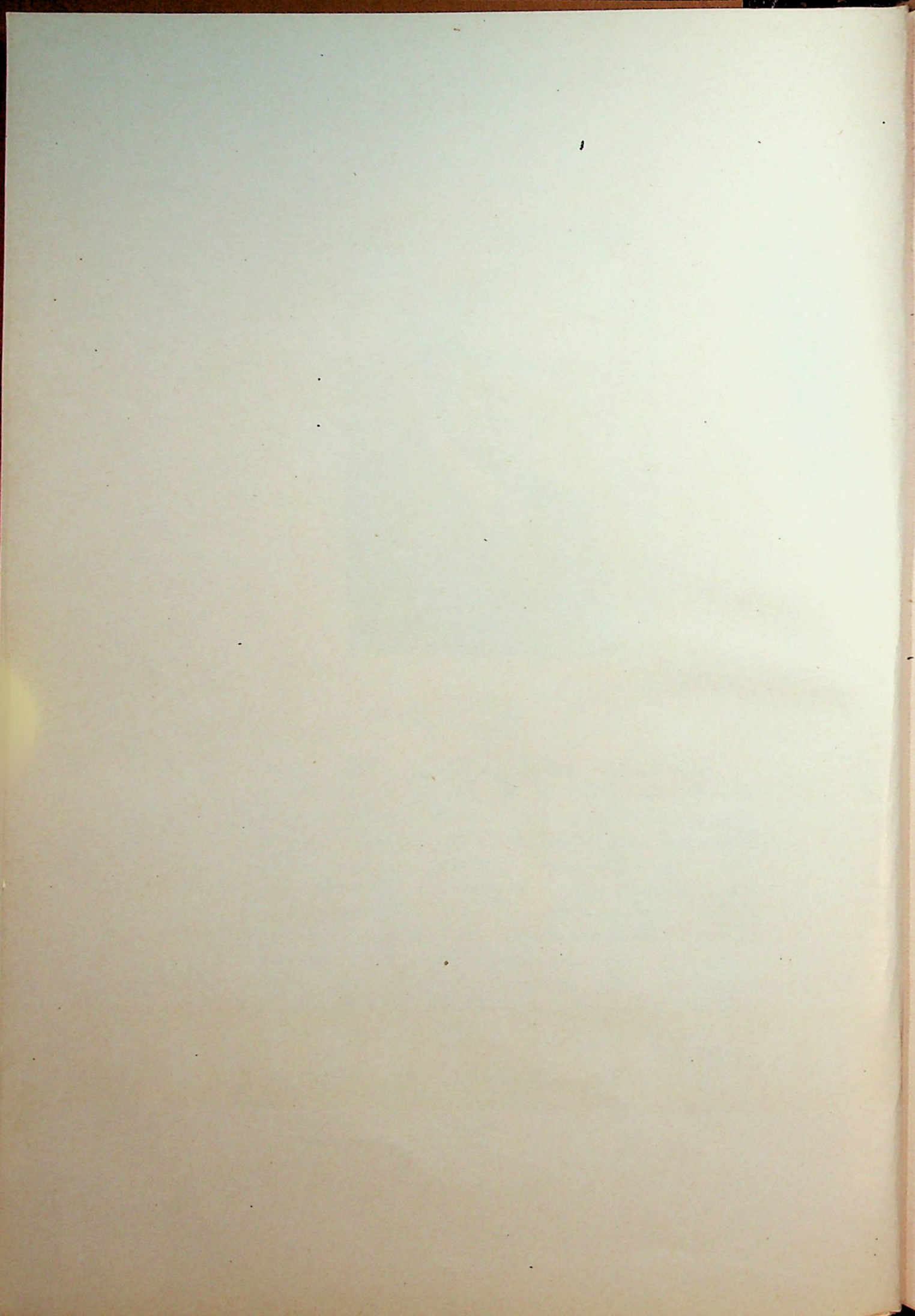


In Memory


CLASS PROPHECY

PHYLLIS DAVIS WILLS HER ABILITY TO GET A DIAMOND TO HER SISTER, BETTY.

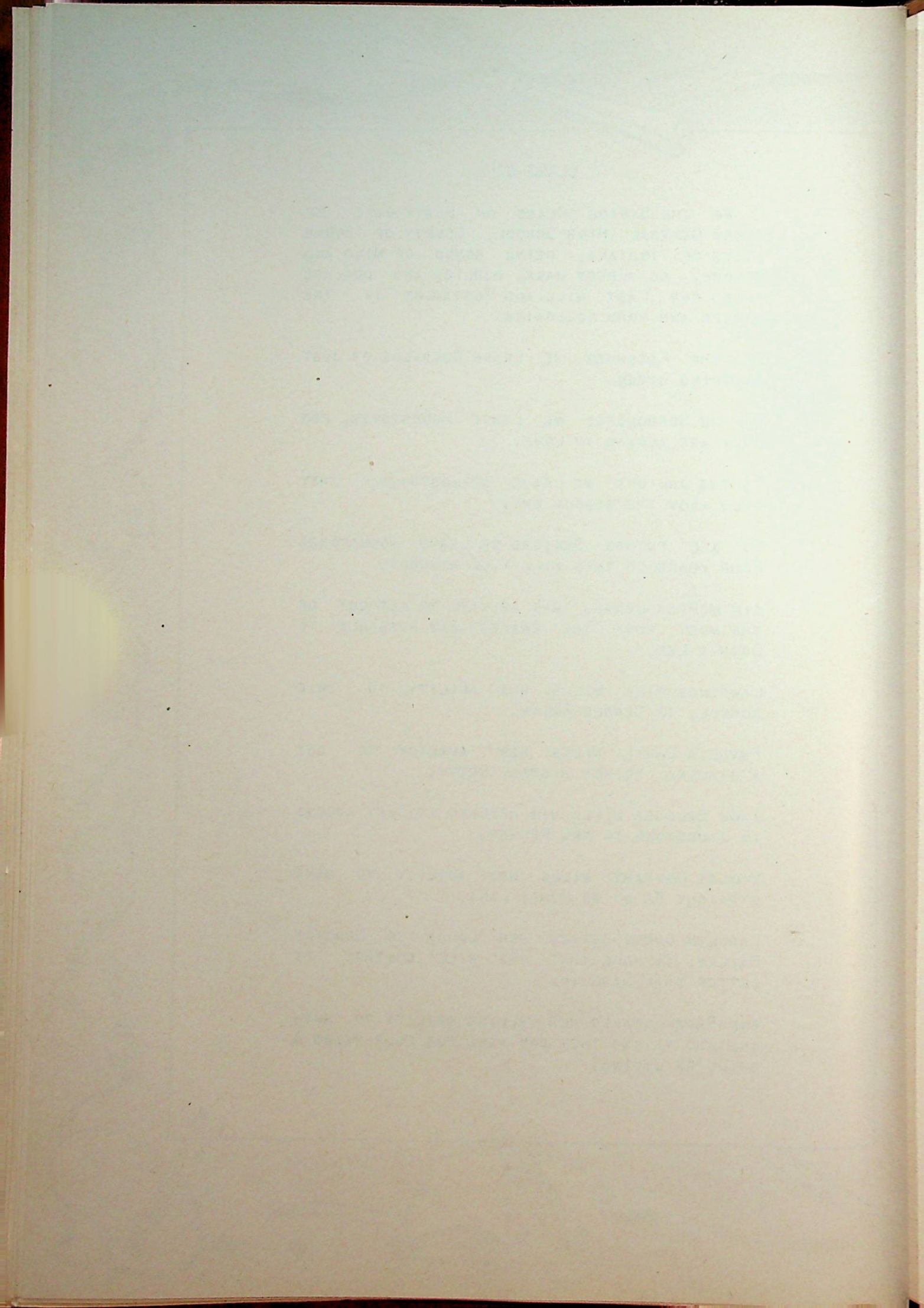

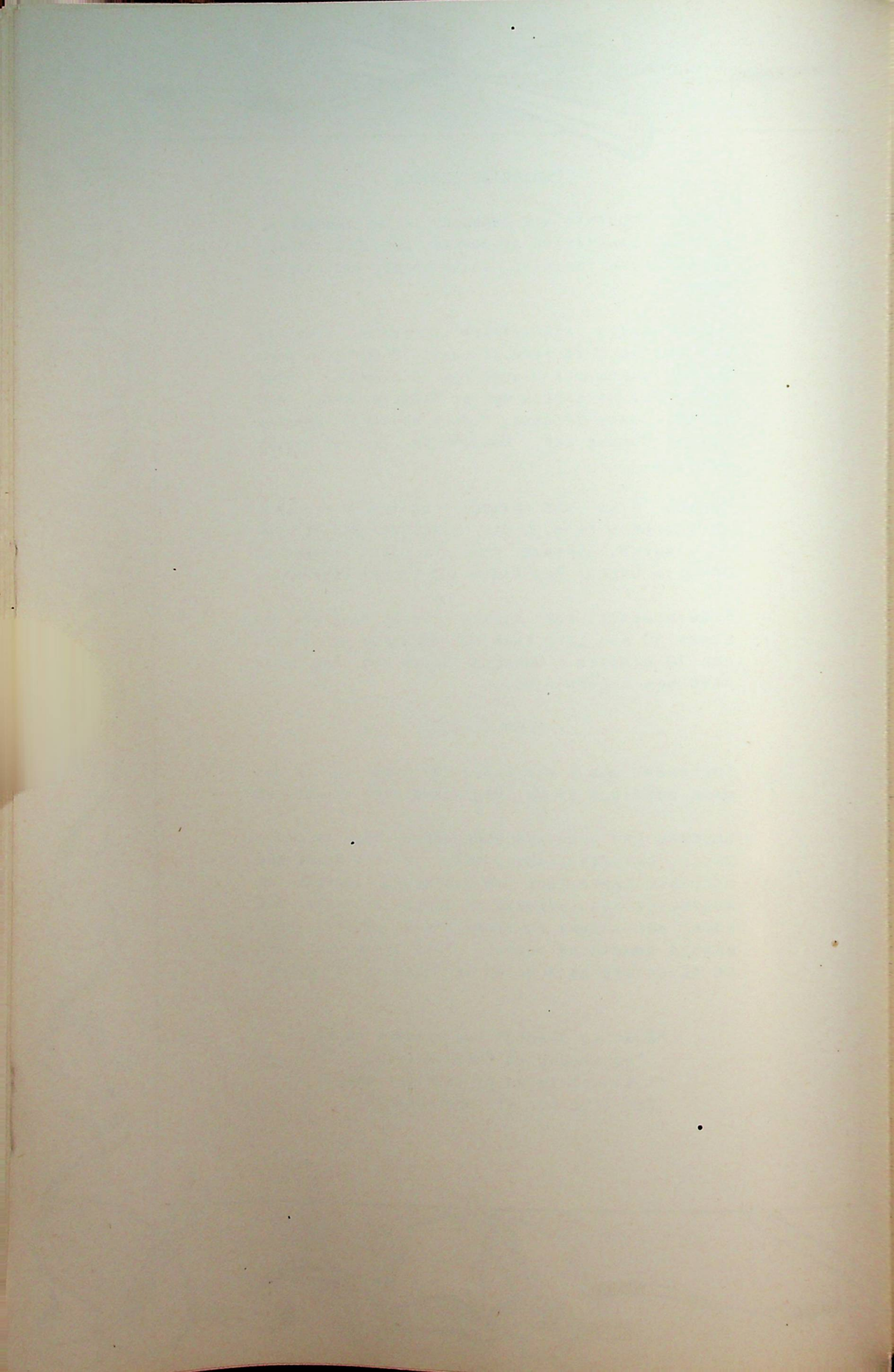
SHOP CLASSES
