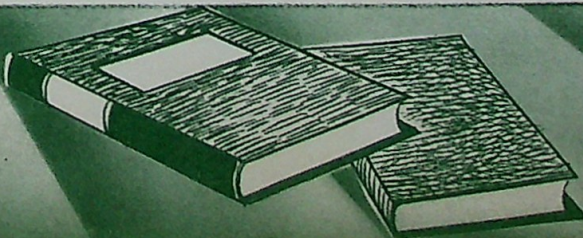
"TO OUR PARENTS"


IN NINETEEN HUNDRED AND FORTY-EIGHT, SEVEN MEMBERS RETURNED FOR ANOTHER TERM OF WORK AND FUN. AGAIN WE CHOSE DONNIE LEE, PRESIDENT; BILL LAND, VICE-PRESIDENT; AND MARVIN SUTPHIN, SECRETARY AND TREASURER; AND MRS. DORIS LANGJAHR AND MRS. OPAL DOYAL, SPONSORS, WHO WORKED HARD TO HELP THE CLASS EARN MONEY BY SELLING CANDY, ICE CREAM, COKES, ETC. DURING THE SCHOOL DAYS AND AT BALL GAMES.

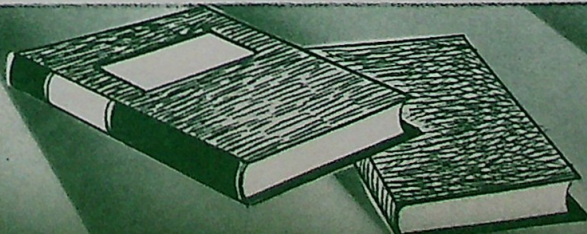

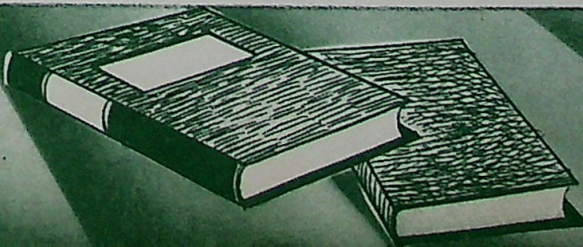

WILL MAKE US THRU THE YEARS RECALL.

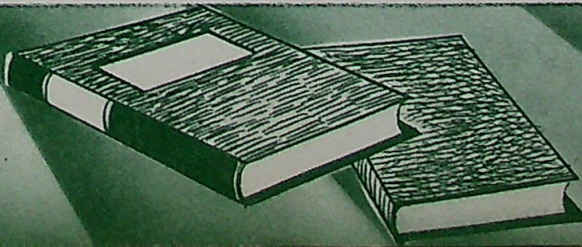
BRIGHT BUT QUIET, THAT'S OUR BETTY
