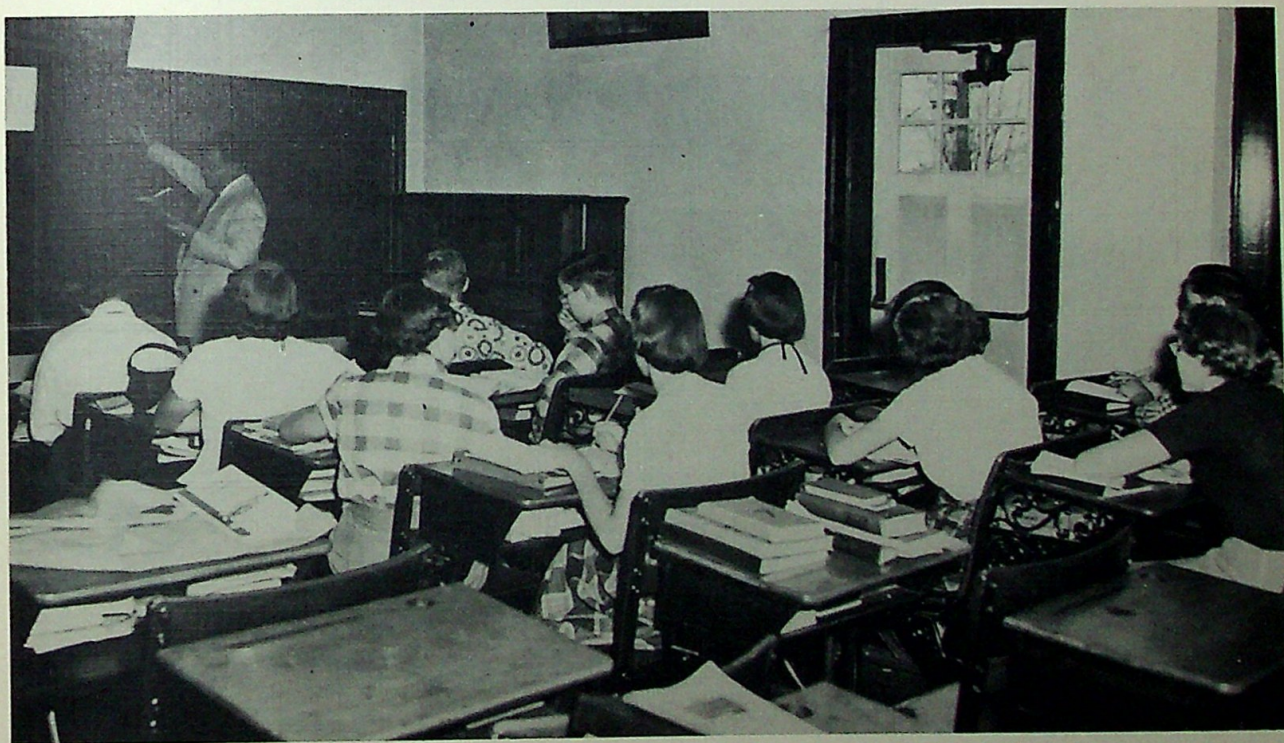
HISTORY—A mock election was held on November 4th, at the same time of the National Election, to impress on the minds of the students the procedure of voting. The use of weekly magazines keeps the students abreast of current events. These are just a few of the projects used to develop a feeling of the responsibilities of becoming a good citizen. The history teachers are Mrs. Casey, Miss Fischer, and Mr. Dickerson.



ENGLISH—English, which is the most essential subject taught, is needed to educate the student in the fundamentals of grammar, composition, letter writing, spelling, and the essentials of leading a successful social and business life. The instructors are Mrs. Shepherd and Mrs. Casey.



SCIENCE—Biology consists of a year's course in the elementary facts and principles of living organisms, protoplasm, the cell tissues, and organs of plants and animals along with their functions. Chemistry is alternated yearly with physics. These subjects present the fundamental theories and concepts which are necessary for those who elect a career based on science. Mr. Bennington teaches all the science classes.



MATHEMATICS—The purpose of the mathematical system is to teach the nature of the number system. Instruction is designed to insure successful growth of mathematical power. The junior high arithmetic teaches the fundamentals on which the advanced courses are based. The advanced courses are: plane and solid geometry, algebra, advanced algebra, and trigonometry. Mr. Sauter and Mr. Dickerson teach mathematics.



COMMERCE—Commerce consists of typing and bookkeeping under the instruction of Mrs. Shepherd and Mr. Small. Typing is designated for students who desire efficiency for office work and skill in personal needs. Bookkeeping prepares students to use business methods and to serve intelligently. The value of bookkeeping is realized in the attainment of a vocation as well as in effective home or private use.



JUNIOR HIGH—The Junior High has been departmentalized this year, and are occupying seats in the assembly. Seventh and eighth grade history and seventh grade mathematics are taught by Mr. Dickerson, eighth grade mathematics by Mr. Sauter, English by Mrs. Casey, Home Economics by Miss Fischer, and Mr. Bennington teaches general science, health and agriculture.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION—Athletic activities are recognized as a definite part of the educational program of Whitestown High School for both boys and girls. The classes are designed to promote physical coordination, develop skill, and present a general knowledge of the techniques and rules of many games. It is also planned for the classes to set up situations through which students may learn in general how to get along well with fellow students which in turn may help them to become better adult citizens. The classes are taught by Miss Fischer and Mr. Dickerson.



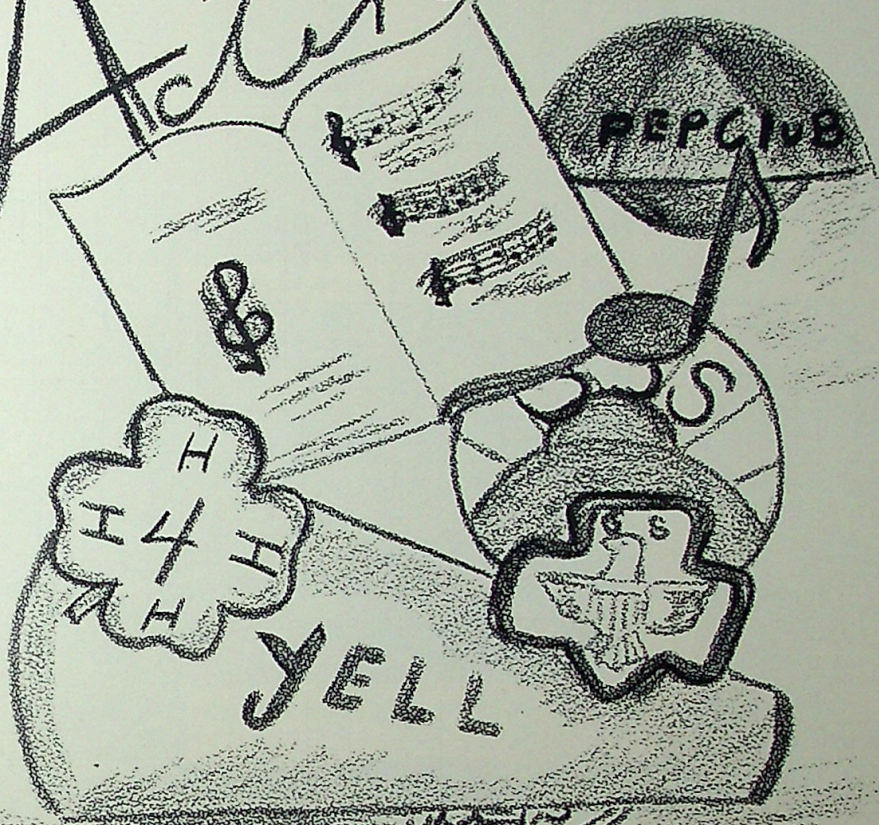


HOME ECONOMICS—These girls receive training in sewing, grooming and nutrition. This experience enables a girl to become better equipped for her future role as a homemaker. Miss Fischer is the instructor.

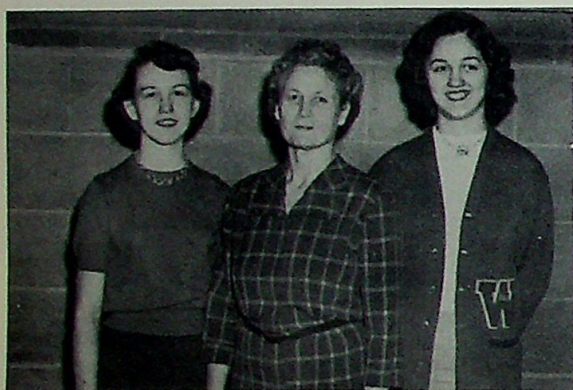
LIBRARY

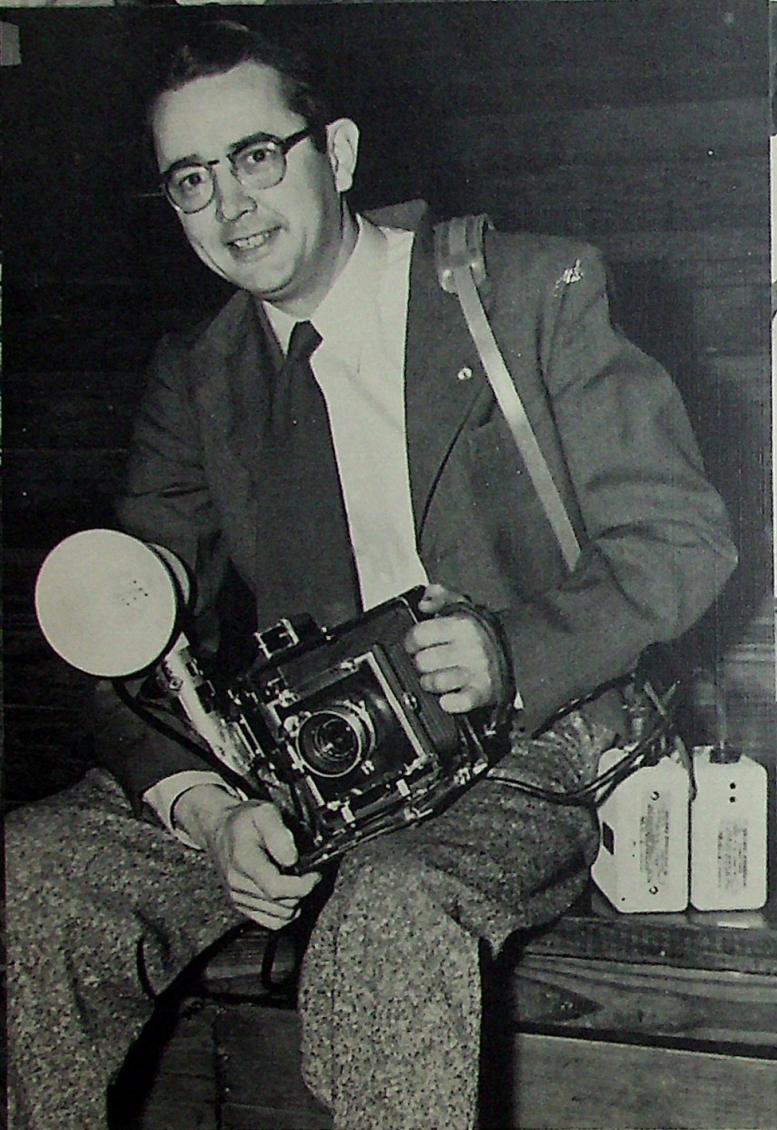
Each year the Alumni has a Dinner and Dance in honor of the Senior Class. This year it will be on May 2, in the Gymnasium, with music by the Home Towners.
