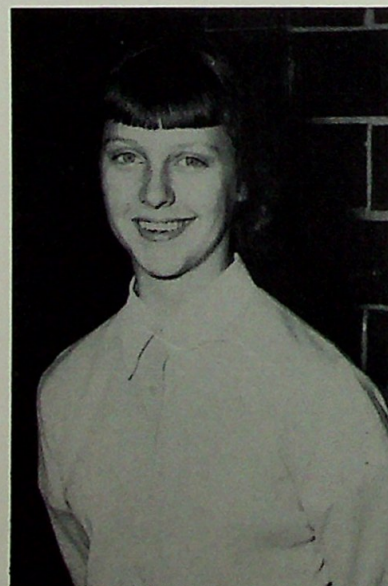
### CLASS MEETING

every grade school student. We hope they enjoy their coming high school years and we wish them luck. This is the eighth grade history class, instructed by Mr. Dickerson.

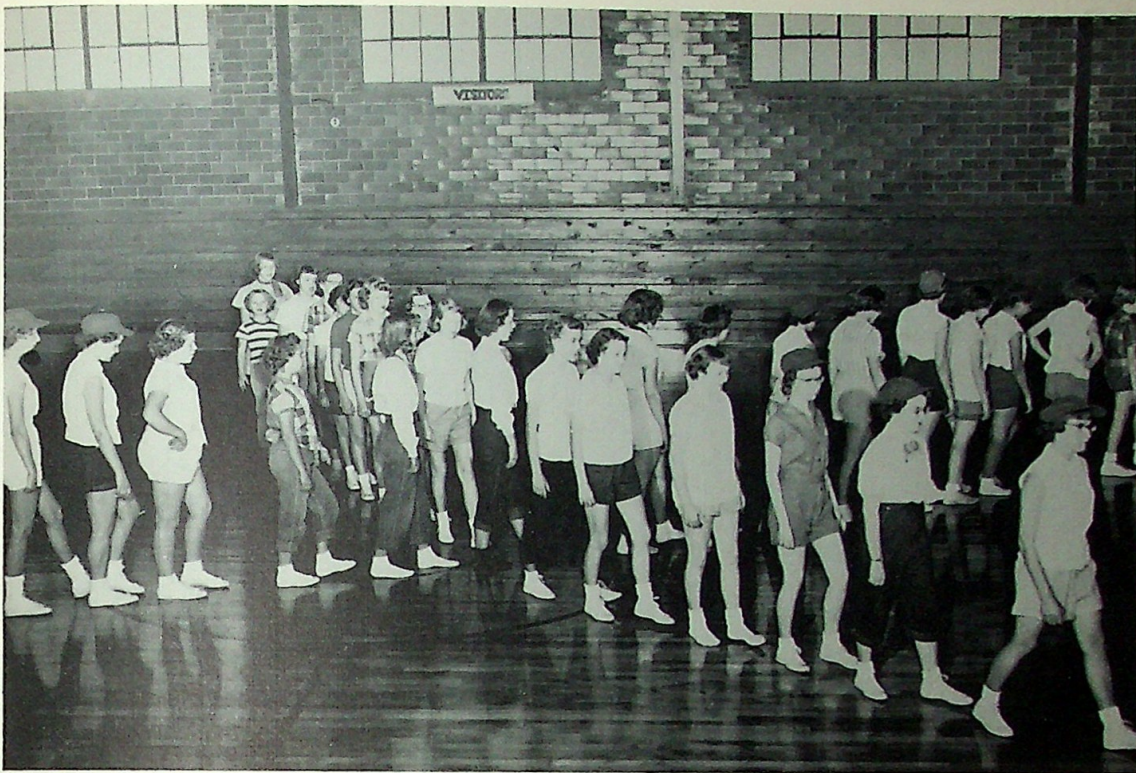


### ENGLISH

semester. The girls learned to prepare nutritious meals, to set an attractive table, and to keep a neat home.



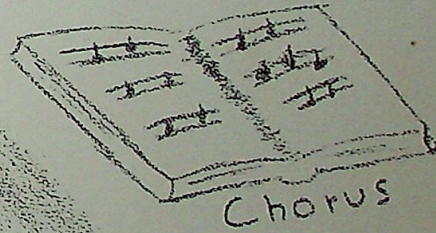
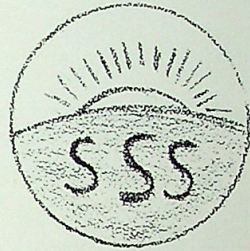
### CAFETERIA

## SENIOR GIRL SCOUTS

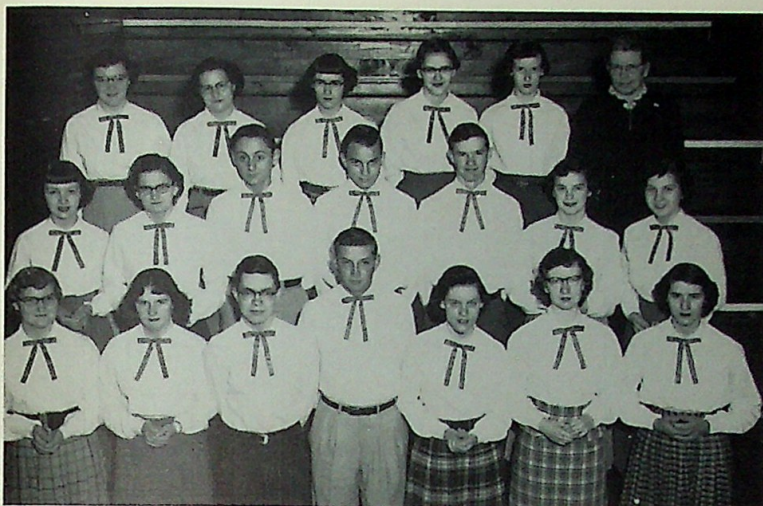

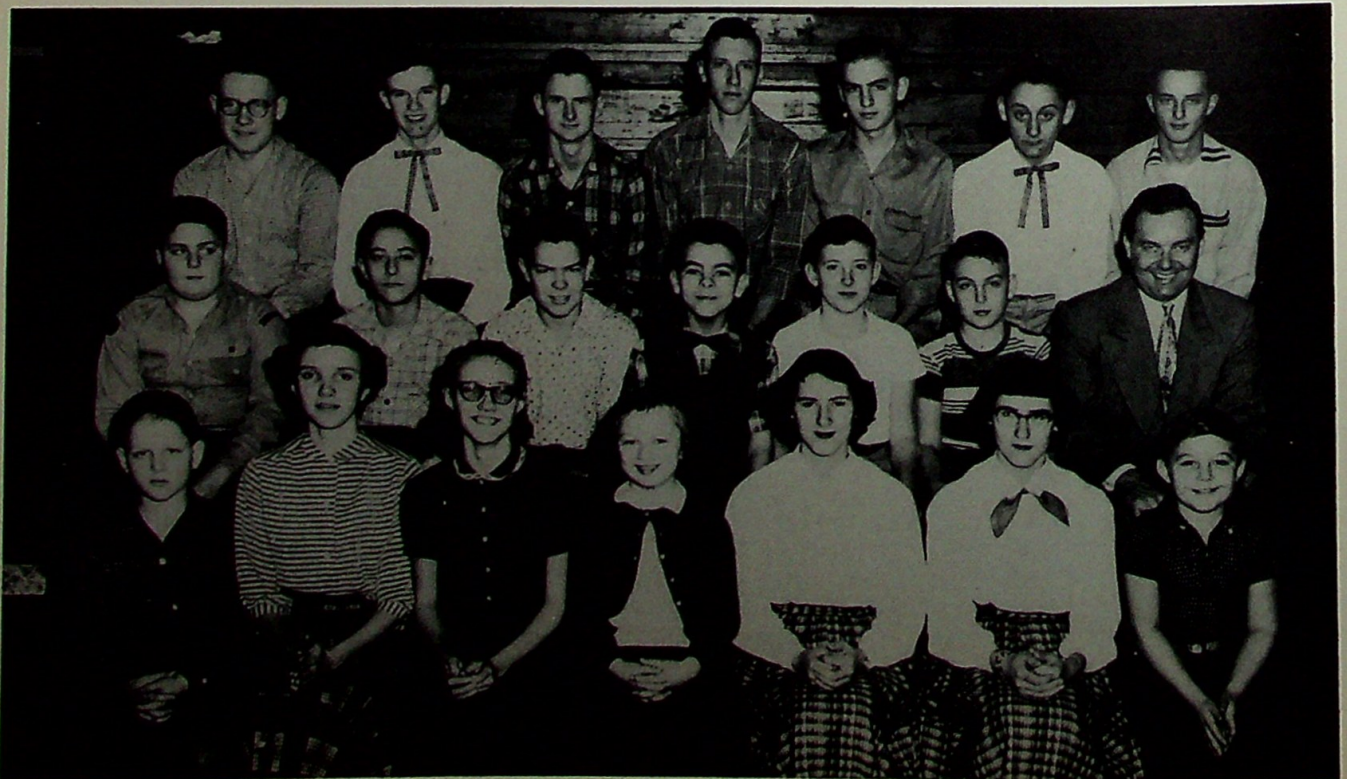




#### 4-H CLUBS
