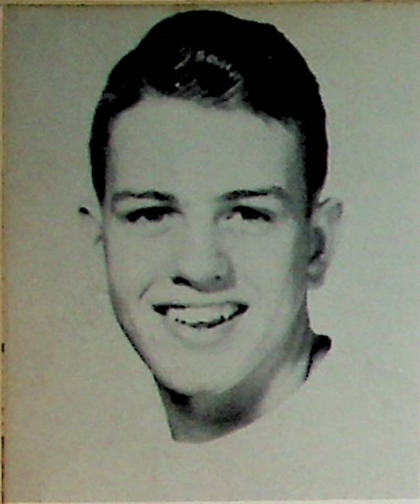
We went back to the Hotel and found that Wilma Sharp was there on a visit. Wilma told us she was married to a man living in California who owned an orange grove.
