Senior Trip



Senior Class Trip

We started on our trip to Washington, D.C. and New York City on May 1, 1955. We left Lebanon at 1:00 P.M. and arrived in Washington, D.C. at 7:30 A.M. the next morning. After checking into our rooms at the New Colonial Hotel, we ate breakfast, then began sight-seeing. In the following order, we visited the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, the Washington Monument, Pan American Union, Jefferson Memorial and Tidal Basin. By this time the forenoon was gone.

In the afternoon, after a very nice lunch at the Sholl's Cafeteria, we toured the residential section of Washington. At the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, we saw the change of guards, then went through Arlington National Cemetery and on to Mount Vernon. From there we drove to the National Airport and the Pentagon Building and made a final stop at the Lincoln Memorial. That evening we took a moonlight cruise down the Potomac River.

Our second day in Washington began with seeing the old Ford Theatre, then, the Lincoln Museum and the old and new Museums of the Smithsonian Institution. After lunch we transferred by sight-seeing bus to Capitol Hill. Here, after a tour through the U.S. Capitol Building, we also saw the Supreme Court and Congressional Library. Then several hours were open for shopping and individual pleasures. That night we ate dinner in the Casino Royal.

We left Washington on Wednesday, May 3 at 8:30 A.M. aboard the Baltimore and Ohio "Capitol Limited" and arrived in Jersey City at 1:30 P.M. We detrained and boarded the Manhattan Ferry, witnessing the famous skyline as we approached. Our motor coach took us directly to our hotel, the Paramount, located on 46th street just off Times Square. We had the rest of the afternoon just to relax and, by this time, we were needing it. That evening, we visited the famous Radio City Music Hall, to witness a first run movie, and also the stage show, featuring the "Rockette Line" in action.

We visited the Empire State Observation Roof, the Little Church around the Corner, Central Park, St. John the Divine Cathedral, China Town, the Bowery, and the lower East Side. We went down to the Battery and took a boat ride out to the Statue of Liberty. We took an NBC Radio and Television tour and had luncheon at the Down Under Restaurant in the RCA Building. We drove out Riverside Drive to Grant's Tomb and Columbia University. In the evening we returned to the roof of the RCA Building for a beautiful night view of the entire city. A photograph of the group was taken here, and the rest of the evening was open. After that we went to see a "dry run" of the \$64,000 Question.

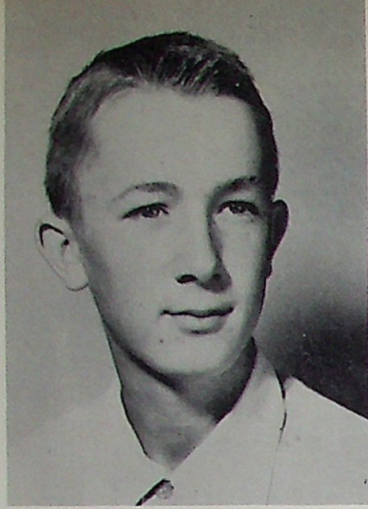
Right after breakfast the next day, we visited the United Nations Building then the rest of the day was open. We took the subway to Coney Island and arrived there about 2:00 P.M. After riding on practically everything, we walked down to the beach and waded along the Atlantic Ocean until 6:30 when we took the subway back to New York City. That evening we went down to China Town, ate supper at the Port Arthur Restaurant, and then walked down through the Bowery.

Saturday, May 7, we boarded our motor coach, this time to cross the Hudson and view the fading skyline leaving for Jersey City. In the afternoon, we left Jersey City aboard the Baltimore and Ohio "National" and arrived in Indianapolis the next morning at 10:40 A.M. then on home to Lebanon at 11:30 A.M. We all had a good time, but we were mighty glad to get home.

We were certainly grateful to our sponsors, Mr. and Mrs. Russell Ratliff, for their excellent supervision and for the many new experiences we had with them. They were wonderful to us! Looking back on it all now, we know we gained much from this trip and we do appreciate all Mr. and Mrs. Ratliff did for us.
