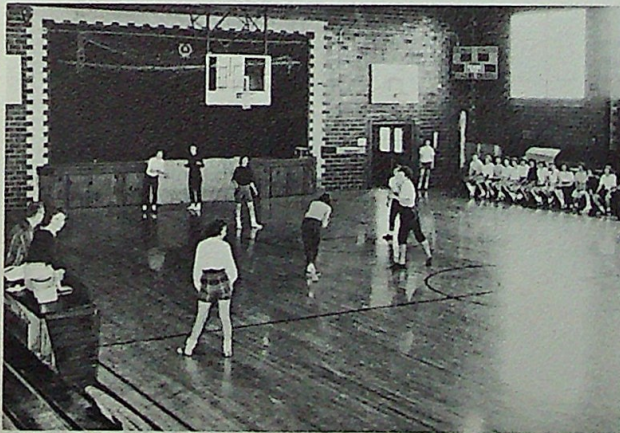

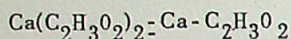

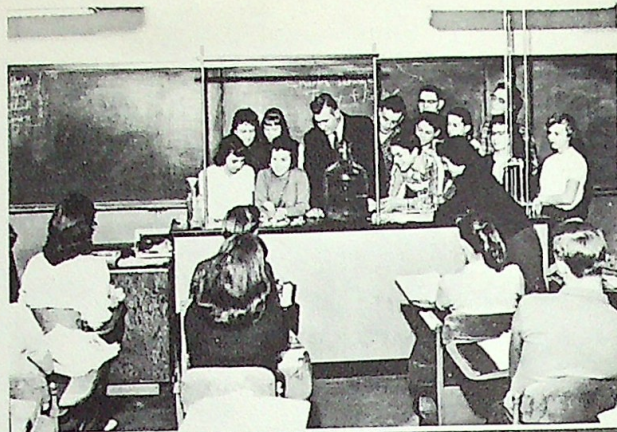

This solemn looking group is the advanced typing class. They are furthering their education for the business world ahead of them.

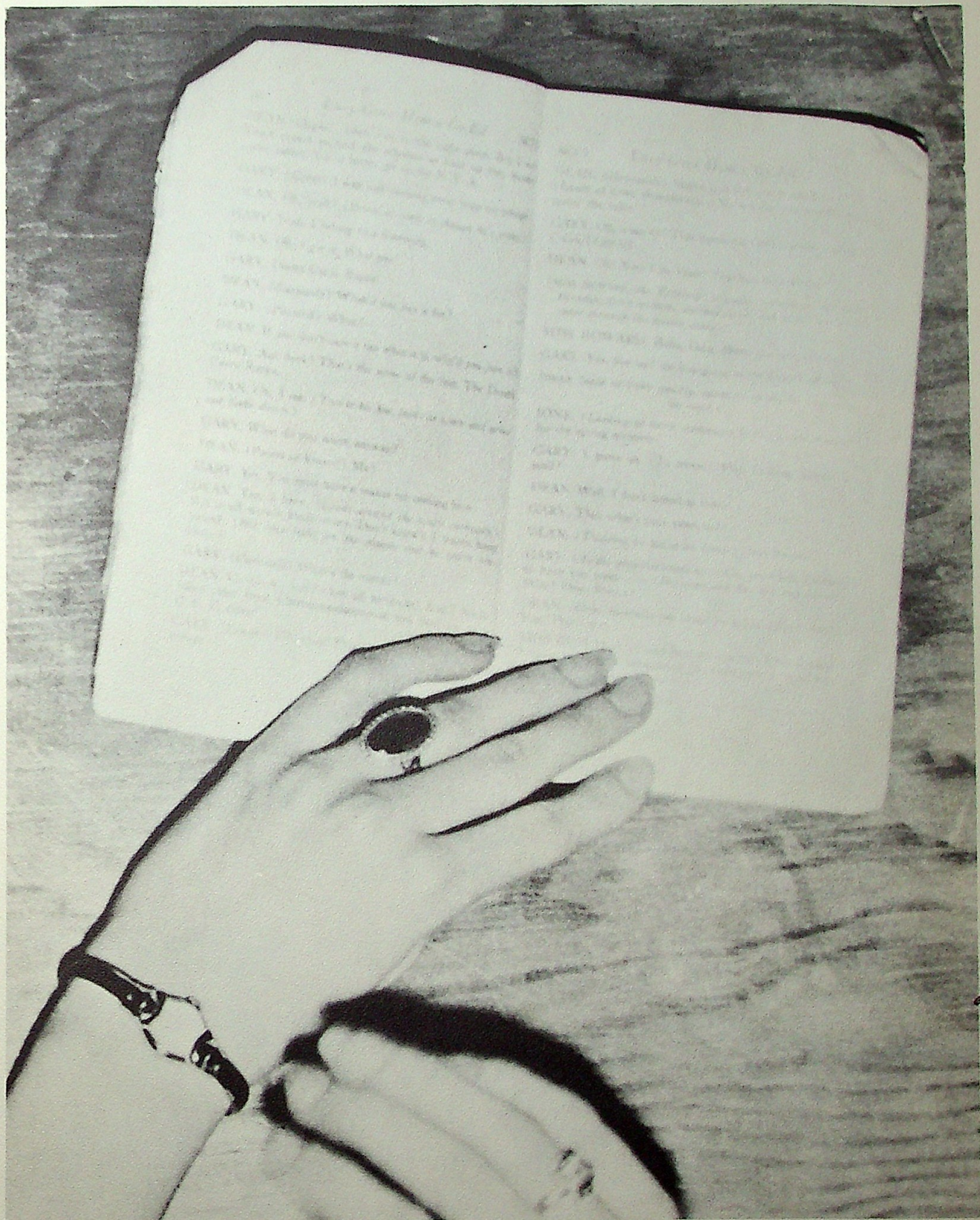


Shorthand Class From this class will come the future secretaries. This class is instructed by Mrs. Baker.

The Worth Township Girls' 4-H Club is pictured above. The Adult Leaders are Mrs. Harmon and Mrs. Loveless.



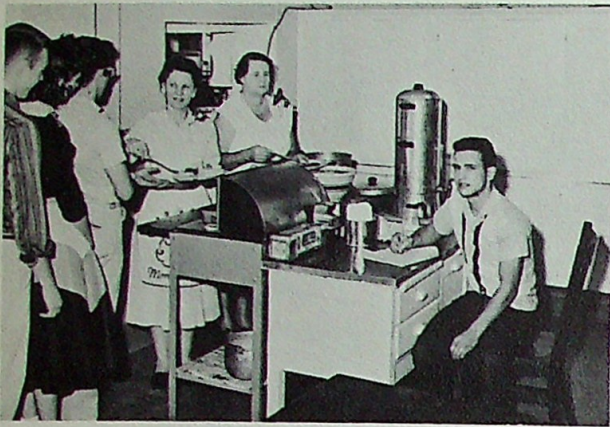
