Keeping a daily weather record has been a very acknowledging experience for the Fourth Grade, who are finding below zero readings quite normal lately.

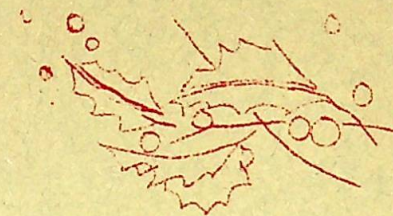

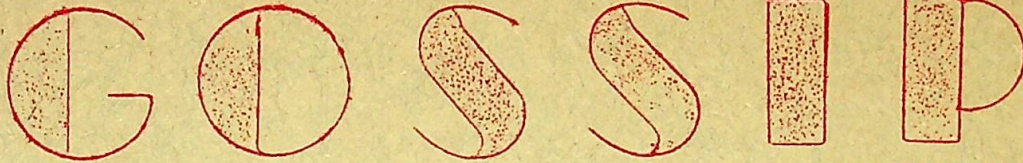
