RECIPES FOR OYSTER PIE

This recipe came from my great-grandma. Years ago, my father's mother died when he was just 4 years old and his grandma and aunts and uncles raised him. It was a tradition to have an oyster pie for their New Years dinner. It has been handed down to Mother, as she made it, too. My father died at the age of 89, fifteen years ago. I am past 80, so this recipe is an old one.

Make a good dough and line a long dish about 12x6x2", or any other pan you might have, with dough. Sprinkle a little flour on it; layer the oysters seasoned with salt, pepper and chunks of butter, then another layer or strips of dough and another or oysters. Cover with strips of dough or a cover of dough. Bake till nice and brown, same as a pie.

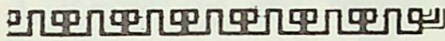
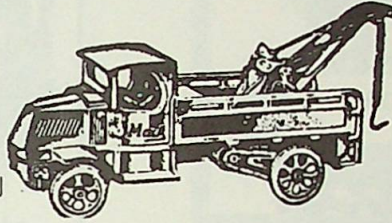

1 1/2 tbsp. ginger 1 tbsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. soda

Add above mixture. Stir in flour,
about what you can with a spoon.
Let stand overnight. Roll, cut and

degree oven.

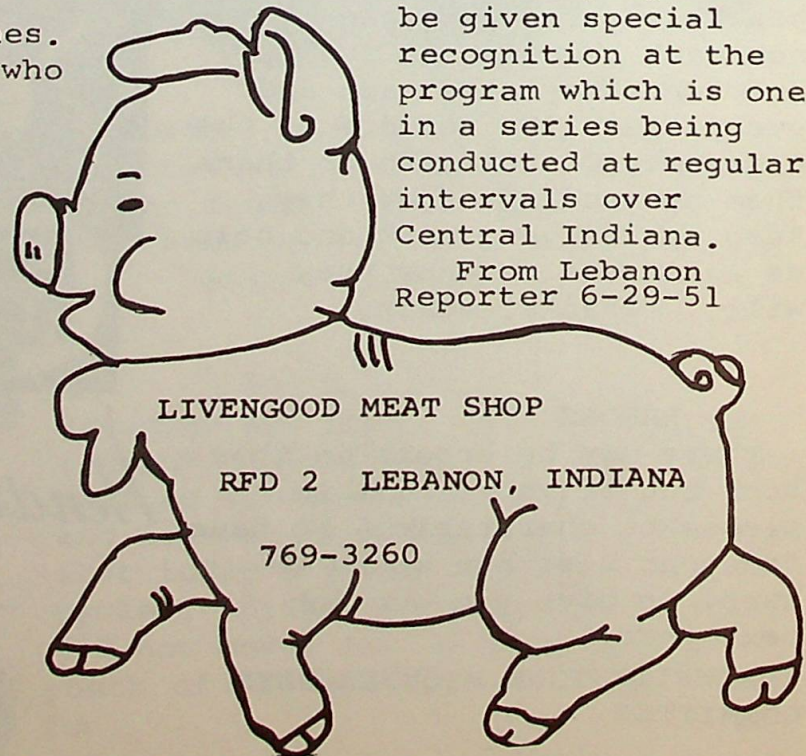

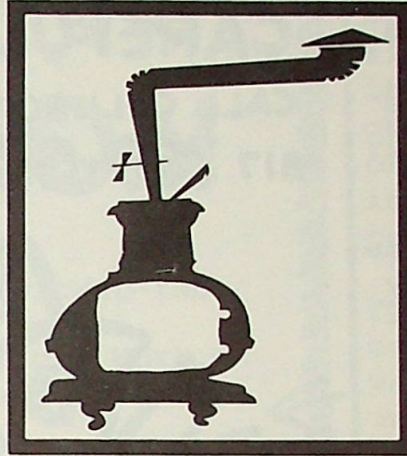

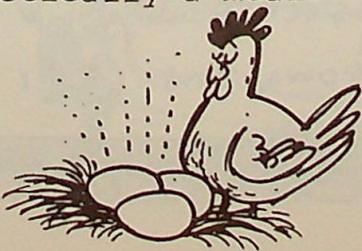

There's been a Laughner
Drug store in Whitestown a
long, long time.

In fact, there's been a
Laughner Drug store as long
as there's been a Whites-
town.

The name "Laughner" came
into the picture a century
ago when Ambrose M. Laugh-
ner purchased the store
from John Donaldson, who
had previously bought it
from a Mr. Peters and C. W.
Shoemaker.

But when there's mention
of Laughner's Drug Store,
the person that's thought
of is Clyde O. Laughner,
son of Ambrose, who has operated the store for the past years, besides
holding numerous other positions of responsibility in Whitestown.

One of those duties and certainly not the least important is that of
official government weather observer and recorder.

Mr. Laughner started working for the government on Oct. 1, 1910, and has
been the man to talk to when the argument comes up about how much rain fell
last night or the night before since that time.

Not long ago, he was awarded a certi-
ficate of merit for distinguished
service by United States weather offic-
ials.

Mr. Laughner also has been secretary-
treasurer of the Whitestown Citizens
Telephone Company since 1914 with the
exception of a three year period.

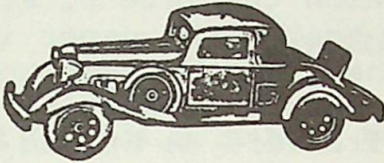

Some of the notations showed he bought salt pork at 6¼ cents per pound, chickens 12 cents each, and apples 20 pounds for 30 cents.

NEWSPAPER HISTORY BEGAN IN 1903

Newspaper work in Whites-
town began in 1903 when
Earl Darnell, now proprie-
tor of the Pioneer Printing
Company, began publishing
the Whitestown Hustler, a
weekly.

Five years later he sold
the business to L. E. Smith
after which the late B. F.
McMakin bought the paper in
1913, changing the name to
The Dispatch and devoting
his entire life to it and
the printing shop.

His son, Robert G. Mc-
Makin and daughter-in-law,
Catherine now operate the
shop. In addition, Mrs.
McMakin has served since
1936 as correspondent for
the Lebanon Reporter.

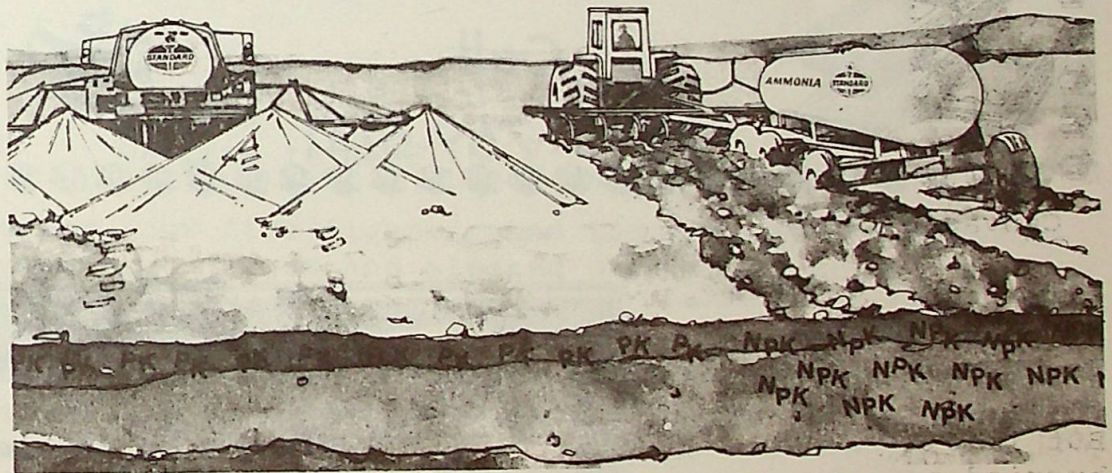
Centennial Event



Dear Madam:

Your husband Louis Snell, 26 Indiana Vol. wishes me to write you to inform you of his condition. He was wounded on the 27th inst. Has a flesh wound in the left hip. It is quite a severe and painful wound, but it is not dangerous. He will probably entirely recover, though it will require some time. He wishes me to write you that he is well cared for and that he hopes you will not worry about him.

I wish to assure you that he will receive all the care that can be given him, and with the blessing of God, we hope in fact, have every reason to believe he will return to you in due time as sound as when he left you.

The agent of the U. S. Christian Commission will retain this and inform you to what hospital he is sent or any additional particulars he may see fit. Now my dear madam, be assured that your husband is not dangerously wounded. He is doing well. Be not unduly anxious. Cast your care on the Lord who careth for you and him.

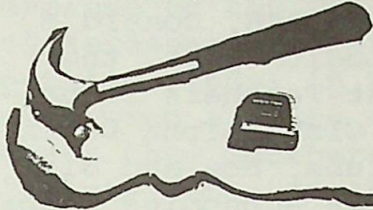


Saturday is "Whitestown Day" in Lebanon.

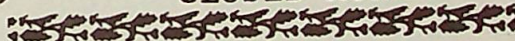

What of crushed dried egg shells mixed with natural bee honey to loosen the sticky throat and how about the guinea pig concoction of a teaspoon of sugar with a few drops of kerosene on top which made you fear either of blowing or burning up, knowing kerosene was both explosive and flammable. A snort of whiskey wasn't anything sinful in those days either but only in times of high fever and taken with a glass of hot lemonade or cup of tea; and to make sure you'd sweat, they smothered you with oodles of quilts, comforters and old Indian blankets, etc. If this didn't quite do the trick, a hot water bottle was tossed in to boot. OLD FASHIONED VEGTABLE SOUP

This recipe is one of my rich memories of pioneer life in Boone County. I lived there until I was 14, I am now 88 and still retain keep memories of my girlhood days. Winters were cold and for men coming from farm work and children from school, chilled to the bone, the odor of this soup and the warmth of it were wonderful.

1 soup bone with scraps of meat on it

Fresh chopped vegetables as:

1 cabbage or part of one

1 or more turnips

1 onion, more if desired

1 rutabaga

3 carrots or more, depending on size

1 good size parsnip

Other vegetables may be added as desired, such as celery, etc.

Boil soup bones, take off all edible meat. Remove the bones. Allow stock to cool so that part of the fat may be removed.

Chop the cleaned and chopped vegetables in a wooden bowl with hand chopper. Place stock and vegetables in large soup kettle. Season to taste: allow to cook until vegetables are done. Serve piping hot with crackers or toast.

DO YOU RECALL ???

Those bundles of 6 pair of "feet" that were ordered to replace worn feet on cotton hose? You cut off the worn feet and sewed on these new feet, there was always that tell tale seam but we wore them for everyday.

When switches made of hair were worn by ladies? Some of the ladies saved combings of their own hair and had them made up, putting them on their head in back and had a large topknot or bun.

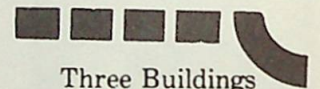

FAMILIAR NAMES IN BUSINESS RECORDED
EARLY

The first election was held in Whitestown in 1852 when Henry Lucas was chosen Justice of the Peace.

Among those doing business in an early day in various capacities were: Wm. T. Givens, David and Caesar Eichman, dry goods; F. M. Moody, groceries and station agent; Nease & Keefe, bakery; J. S. Harmon & J. T. Ross, drugs; John W. Bowser grain dealer and proprietor of a warehouse on south side of railroad. Postmasters were Henry Lucas,

Dr. Ross, Henry Walters, S. M. Trout and J. O. Barb. Doctors in the community included J. T. Ross, Starkey, Larimore and J. S. Hardy.

Early mention is made of two stove factories, three blacksmith shops, two wagon shops and one steam saw mill.

The first grist mill built by Isaac Dye and Alfred Osburn in 1868 was destroyed by fire in 1872. A steam grist mill was built by a Henry Lucas in 1870 and later sold to Henry Dye. Having no water power the township afforded very poor milling facilities and the early settlers found it necessary to journey over dangerous routes to Zionsville, Mechanicsburg or Thorntown. A mill built by J. W. Bowser was operated by him successfully for many years acquiring a good reputation at home and abroad. He sold it in October, 1886, to Riley and Vaughn. The mill had all of the new milling facilities for making the best flour in the state and was probably located where the present mill now stands known as the
